Scotland: Inspiring meetings hear the socialist alternative to cuts

Socialist Party Scotland

Socialist Party Scotland hosted two successful and inspiring public meetings on fighting the cuts and the case for socialism. More than 70 socialists, trade unionists and young people came along to our meetings in Glasgow and Dundee.

More than 50 people came to the Glasgow public meeting. Clare Daly, Socialist Party TD (MP) in the Irish parliament, explained the savage attacks facing the working class of Ireland.

Clare highlighted that the new Fine Gael/Labour coalition government is carrying out the same brutal austerity measures as the previous discredited Fianna Fáil/Green government. Clare and fellow Socialist Party TD Joe Higgins are helping to build support for a mass movement against the cuts in Ireland.

Janice Godrich, the national president of the PCS civil servants' union, explained the militant approach PCS is taking to fight the cuts.

Brian Smith, leader of the Defend Glasgow Services campaign and Glasgow City Unison branch secretary, exposed the reality of the Scottish National Party (SNP) government's cuts agenda. 18,000 public sector jobs are going in 2011-12

in Scotland. Workers are facing pay cuts and attacks on pensions and terms and conditions.

Brian called for a campaign of coordinated strike action against the cuts. The need for political representation was also discussed with the Socialist Party Scotland supporting the idea of a coalition of anti-cuts candidates committed to opposing all cuts at next year's Scottish council elections.

Jamie Cocozza, a member of the Youth Fight for Jobs (YFJ) campaign in Glasgow, outlined the attacks on young people and the campaigning work of YFJ.

Peter Taaffe, the general secretary of the Socialist Party of England and Wales, spoke last. Peter outlined how the world economic crisis has resulted in the capitalist class remorselessly attacking the livelihoods of working class and poor

people. Massive mobilisations of workers and youth have taken place in Greece, Spain and Portugal, and could also take place in Britain.

A lively discussion took place with contributions and questions from those attending the meeting. £360 was collected for the fighting fund. 15 people put their name down to either join or to come to more meetings of the Socialist Party Scotland.

In Dundee, 21 people came along to hear Clare Daly, Peter Taaffe and school student David Mundt speak.

David outlined the work of the Students Defending Dundee Schools (SDDS) campaign that has organised a sizeable campaign against cuts by the SNP council to education funding.

SDDS organised a walkout of hundreds of school students on 1 April. Some school students involved in SDDS were at the meeting.

Carmarthenshire council day club closure lobby

On Wednesday 8 June about 20 people, made up of service users of the Noddfa Teilo Day Club, trade unionists, Llanelli Anti-Cuts Campaign and community activists lobbied Carmarthenshire county council. We were there campaigning for the day centre to be reopened and to support Rhian Barr who, by collecting 1,700 signatures against its closure, was allowed to address the full council.

First we had to sit through a prayer and then the back slapping of council members who congratulated some local sporting celebrities on their achievements. The council found time to talk about a rugby player's relative's cat that was bitten by a dog. But the council was not prepared to debate the closure when Sian Caiach, from the People First Party, attempted to get the subject discussed after Rhian spoke.

Rhian, aged 75, gave an emotional speech. She criticised the council for the speed and the manner in which the council had closed the day club. Rhian read out some comments from Grace, 91, who uses the day club, and had previously chained herself to the railings of Noddfa Teilo in protest against the closure.

Rhian explained how the day club was a lifeline for many and how many would not leave their home all week if they were not attending it. She accused the council of offloading its responsibilities to the voluntary sector without a proper assessment of the needs of the people affected. Rhian called on the council to reverse their decision to close Noddfa Teilo.

This was all filmed by a person in the public gallery. The chair objected to the proceedings being filmed and called the police who arrested the person.

If the Independent/Labour council won't fight the cuts, then they should make way for those that will. We'll make sure that voting for cuts is a lot easier than implementing them.

Arriving in Dewsbury on the day of an English Defence League (EDL) march, I was immediately met with an incredibly tense atmosphere. Police vans patrolled round the town centre. Many shops, even large chains, were closed and those that were open had only a few customers visiting.

When the EDL arrived in Dewsbury, people greeted them with jeers and insults, before they moved (UAF) demo. While there, the EDL continually tried to break their kettle and instigate a fight.

Following both rallies, I made my way back to Leeds. There, by sheer chance I got off my bus right next to where the EDL buses were emptying and immediately heading to pubs in Leeds as the centre swarmed with police. And the EDL were again met with contempt. People even ran out of shops and pubs the EDL entered to let the police know.
