Socialism 2011 will be a showcase for the socialist alternative to a world in crisis.

Three years ago capitalist 'boom' turned into a catastrophic bust. In Britain £2 trillion of wealth was wiped out. Entire countries - Iceland, Greece, Ireland and Portugal - have gone bankrupt. Others may follow. In virtually every 'rich world' country brutal austerity is demanded by governments.

Mass unemployment, cuts to public services, and increased taxes are demanded to satisfy the super-rich speculators on the international financial markets.

But across Europe austerity has been met with mass protests and general strikes. In Britain up to 700,000 people marched against cuts in the biggest trade union demonstration ever. On 30 June over 750,000 public sector workers took strike action in opposition to attacks on pensions, jobs and services.

In Wisconsin and other states in the United States, hundreds of thou-

sands of workers have protested and occupied in response to attacks on trade union rights.

And across the Middle East and North Africa revolutions and uprisings have toppled dictators. The world is being reshaped around us.

If the super-rich and their big business politicians have their way, their profits and bonuses will be secured by the destruction of our living standards.

Capitalism is a system that puts the profits of the few ahead of the needs of the vast majority. But capitalism is not 'normal' or 'natural'. There is another way of running the world. Socialism 2011 will put forward the socialist alternative.

Following the Rally for Socialism on the Saturday night, cheap dinners will be available at the Party for Socialism. During the day there will be food on sale in the ULU snack bar.

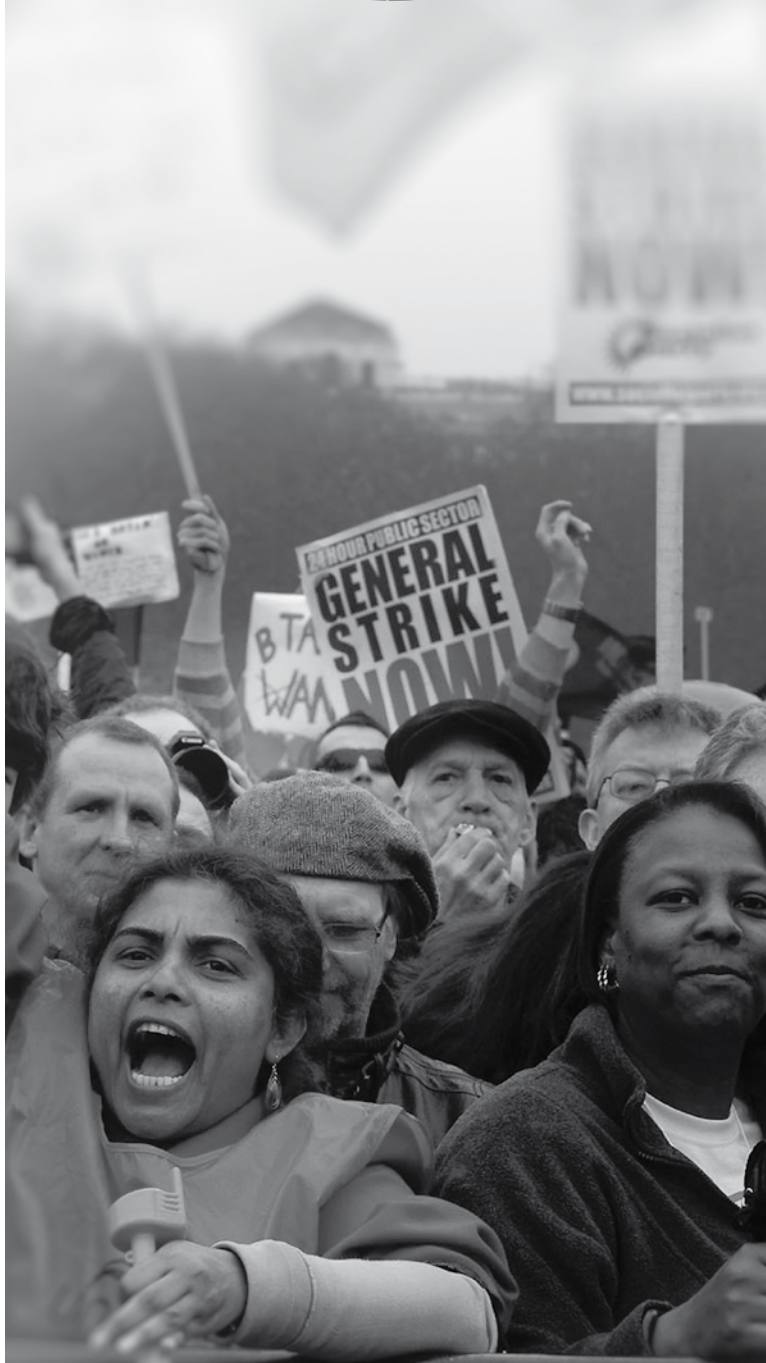
## Accessibility
