





## Where is the camp?

Danbury Youth Camp, Well Lane, Danbury, Essex, CM3 4AB. It is about 10 minutes from Chelmsford, on the A414 between Chelmsford and Maldon. Turn off the A12 towards Maldon, then turn right at the Bell pub in Danbury. The camp is first on your right. There are buses from Chelmsford station, or we can arrange lifts if you contact us in advance.

## What do I need to bring?

A tent and a sleeping bag. You can do your own cooking or buy evening meals from the camp kitchen. You will need a plate and knife and fork for this. Tea, coffee and cold drinks are available all day and there will be a burger bar in the evenings. Tents and mattresses can be hired but you must book these in advance. Don't forget warm clothing and waterproofs. A torch can be handy.

## How much does it cost?

£40 per waged adult, £25 unwaged or low-paid adult, £12 for a child and £95 for a family. There will be a charge for sporting activities like archery and canoeing, to cover the cost of instructors. As well as the organised activities there will be a football tournament for all ages and abilities. There will be a quiz and an opportunity to show off your musical talents round the camp fire. If you want to organise any other games or activities, let us know in advance.

## What is provided at the camp?

There are good showers and other facilties. There is a crèche available during all the political sessions. The campsite is in 70 acres of wooded park land, within walking distance of pubs and shops.
