We say:

- **End austerity** – no to five more years of cuts to jobs, education and public services
- **Stop welfare cuts** – no compulsory workfare for 18-21 year olds, defend housing benefit
- **Fight poverty pay** – raise the minimum wage to £10 now, scrap zero-hour contracts
- **Defend education** – no to cuts and tuition fees
- **Democratic rights** – stop attacks on the rights to protest, organise in trade unions and go on strike. For proportional representation and votes at 16.

Our new, extra-vicious Tory government is planning an austerity budget for us, to benefit the billionaires. Education, jobs, welfare, the NHS: nothing will be spared Osborne's axe.

But with Labour leadership hopefuls obsessing over how best to fit in to Tory clothes, we know the real opposition to this carnage will be built on the streets, not in parliament.

As young people, our future is being sold off to line the pockets of the rich. With new slave labour schemes planned for unemployed young people, a housing crisis meaning we're forced to live with our parents, and low pay and zero-hour contracts now seen as standard, it's clear if we don't fight, the outlook is bleak.

The government thinks the election gave it a mandate for more cuts cruelty. But the Tories only got 24% of the electorate's support.

In reality, they are an unpopular, weak and potentially divided government. If we build a mass movement of working class and young people, we can kick them out.

When the Queen's Speech took place, it was greeted with protests in cities all over the country. Now we need to build up the momentum and make sure Osborne's budget is met with a huge day of action.

On 8 July - budget day - we are planning another, even bigger, national day of protest. Join us to send a message to Osborne and his super-rich friends: we are building the fightback!
